Topic - Record Keeping

Record keeping is an important part of every project and you should be keeping records on your project. You will need to know why records are important to keep and what type of records should be kept. Your club advisor should review your book and sign off on its completion for the 2020 project year.

Topic - Body & Hoof Parts

Juniors may be asked to identify 10 body parts and parts of the hoof. Intermediate may be asked to identify 12 body parts. Seniors may be asked to identify 15 body parts.

Topic - Breeds

Juniors may be asked to identify 5 breeds. Intermediates may be asked to identify 8 common breeds. Seniors may be asked to identify 8 breeds by their traits.

Topic - Skeleton

Seniors may be asked to identify 10 parts of the skeleton.

Topic – Conformation

Juniors may be asked to identify front and rear views of leg confirmation. Intermediates and seniors may be asked to identify topline, front, side, and rear views of leg confirmation.

Topic – Health Diseases

Intermediates may have to identify up to 5 common health concerns by their picture. Seniors may be asked up health questions based on disease and illness definitions.

Topic - Feed & Feed Tags

Juniors may be asked to identify common feeds and answer questions by reading a feed tag. Seniors may be asked to answer questions by reading a feed tag.

Topic – Medication Label

Intermediates and seniors may be asked questions by reading a medication label/medication insert.

Topic – Project Knowledges
