## **Across County Lines Request**

OSU Extension policy is that youth should participate in the 4-H program in their county of residence. Each county program received money for operations from their county government and local volunteers work hard to support their local programming. Therefore, across county membership is strongly discouraged.

If you have youth interested in joining your club that live out-of-county, they MUST complete a *Request for Membership Across County Lines* form and submit it to the 4-H Educator in the county where membership is being requested. NOTE: This must be done as early as possible in the 4-H year as counties have different enrollment deadlines and the form may need to be processed earlier than the county deadline.

The policy and form may be printed from our website: geauga.osu.edu (4-H Youth Development, Club Information and Forms).

The Geauga County deadline is March 15<sup>th</sup>.

Permission for 4-H membership across county lines should NOT BE assumed by the parents of the child or advisors until official notification is received from the 4-H office I the county of request.

## Stop and Call our office if .....

- You cannot find your family profile. **DO NOT** create a new one.
- You are a new member or volunteer
- · You do not have access to the internet

By allowing you access, you can update your club and project information as well as personal information (email, home address, phone, etc). This will ensure that you are properly enrolled in the county program and receive important news and updated such as newsletters, deadline information, and leadership opportunities. Projects cannot be changed/added after the April 15 enrollment deadline.

Enrollment deadline for 2024 is April 15<sup>th</sup> (Club may have an earlier deadline).

## **Enrollment Materials**

Several Ohio 4-H policy updates have occurred since last enrollment. When completing and submitting enrollment materials, please take note of the following updated items and requirements for 2024.

- Volunteer Standards of Behavior
- Youth Code of Conduct (Includes parents)
- Photo Release Member and Volunteer
- Shooting Sports Permission form included with members enrollment in 4HOnline.
- Club By-Laws & Constitution Clubs must submit a new, signed copy by April 15<sup>th.</sup>
- Club Blanet Certificate Clubs must submit a form by April 15<sup>th</sup> or before purchasing project books, whichever comes first. A copy will be included in the annual club packets.
- Club Inventory Lists Will be due January 31st starting in 2025.

# **Volunteer BCI Background Checks**

Ohio 4-H volunteers are required to submit for a BCI every 4 years of continued service. Those volunteers who needed rescreened were mailed a letter with fingerprint instructions. To continue your service as a 4-H volunteer, Ohio BCI checks must be completed, and a copy of the receipt must be submitted to the Geauga Extension Office by **February 15**<sup>th</sup>.

## **New 4-H Volunteers**

Potential 4-H volunteers for the 2024 year must complete the OSU 4-H Volunteer Screening and Selection process before **March 31, 2024.** 

- **Step 1:** Submit a Volunteer Application and references to the Extension Office.
- **Step 2:** Club organizational advisor must provide a letter of support for the potential volunteer.
- Step 3: Complete a BCI Screening.
- **Step 4:** Contact the Extension Office to arrange an interview.
- **Step 5:** Complete OSU's required trainings.

Potential volunteers should not complete any trainings until instructed to do so by the Extension Office.

## 2024 Poultry Project Requirements – FIRST YEAR PROJECT MEMBERS ONLY

Youth wishing to enroll in any poultry project for their first time and exhibit their project with Jr. Fair must participate a poultry clinic. This requirement has been implemented as there is a growing need for poultry husbandry education throughout both programs. Quality Assurance training will be taught at all clinics, fulfilling the members QA requirements for the year. This project requirement is for ALL first year poultry project members, regardless of age and those re-enrolling in a poultry project that didn't complete this requirement in the past.

Due to spacing availability, Poultry Clinic QA is not an additional option for returning members. Members can attend QA on May 4<sup>th</sup>, complete the online QA for a fee, or test out if age eligible. See QA Packet for complete details (coming soon).
