2023 Project Judging Information

Online Livestock Project Judging 2023: Beef, Dairy, Dogs, Goats, All Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep, and Swine

Project judging will be open from July 1 through 11:59pm, July 15.

Do not wait until the last minute. The system will automatically close at 11:59pm, stopping any in-progress activity, resulting in an incomplete test.

Online Skillathon Test Project Judging

Project completion tests are an Ohio 4-H approved skillathon test. Completion of test and project book reviewed by the club advisor results in project completion for 2023.

- Tests are age based (as of January 1, 2023) not years in project.
- Tests are species based. Ex: All goat projects (pygmy, pack, meat, etc.) will take the Goat test.
- Members complete one test per species.
- Youth must correctly enter an email address to have their score emailed to them. Please print a copy of the email for your records and to share with your club advisor.
- There is no time limit for the test and a while a minimum score is not required, members should still take this method of project completion seriously.
- Project judging scores may be taken into consideration for year-end awards.
- Members can take the tests from any computer or smartphone. Youth are welcome to take their tests at the Extension Office if they need assistance. Prior arrangements must be made.
- Youth must complete the entire test in one sitting.
- Youth should only take the test one time. The first test score recorded will be the official score.
- Incomplete tests will result in incomplete project judging. Members with incomplete judging status will not be eligible
 for Jr. Fair exhibition/participation in the incomplete project area.
- Technical difficulties must be communicated to the Extension Office prior to the deadline.

Scenario: Dakota's 4-H age is 16. This is his second year in Market Ducks, fifth year in Market Turkey, and first year in Beef Breeding. To complete project judging, Dakota's club advisor will review his books and he will complete the Poultry Senior Test and Beef Senior Test.

Late Project Completion: July 17-21.

- Youth who fail to complete their judging by the deadline must contact the Extension Office.
- Youth must complete their judging tests at the Extension Office during regular office hours by appointment only.
- There is a \$25 per project late fee for completion after 11:59pm on July 15th.

NEW OPTION: 2023 State Fair Online Skillathon

Certificate of Completion due to the Extension Office by July 15th

Youth may choose to fulfill their 2023 Geauga County Project Judging requirement by completing the Online State Fair Skillathon. Youth completing a State Fair Skillathon do not need to complete the county version.

Youth must submit a copy of their certificate of completions (received upon completion) to the Extension Office by 11:59pm on July 15th. Certificates can be emailed to faudie.2@osu.edu or ward.714@osu.edu.

Note: State Fair Skillathons are date/time stamped. It is the member's responsibility to complete the skillathon and submit their certificate by July 15th, 11:59pm. Completing skillathon at State Fair will not fulfill the county requirement as in-person State Fair skillathons occur **after** the July 15th deadline.

Greener Fields 4-H Club, in partnership with all of Geauga County 4-H and Dr. Augustine Kellis, will again be running a food drive for the Geauga Hunger Task Force. Our drive this year is being led by Jayme O'Neill and our Food Drive Committee. The GHTF supports five local food pantries in Geauga County, as well as provides support to NextStep, to groups that deliver home based meals, to provide lunch meals to Seniors at Chagrin Falls Park Community Center, financial support to local churches providing community meals, financial support to Claridon Cares which provides summer lunches to students, and to the Veterans pantry.

All donations and money from 4-H clubs and businesses who give through the 4-H drive will be matched up to \$20,000. In 2022, the Geauga 4-H and business donations, plus the match from Dr. Kellis, totaled a little over \$42,000.00!!! A tally sheet and food drive and contact information are attached. Please note the food drive is ending August 1 this year to give us all plenty of time to prepare for fair. REGISTERING FOR JR. FAIR

Tips for Exhibitors making Online Entries:

- Recommended browsers: Google Chrome or Mozilla Firefox. Older versions of Internet Explorer may cause unexpected results.
- Register all entries for each exhibitor in the family before proceeding to the Payment section.
- Be sure to click the "Submit" button when you have completed your entries. Entries are not final until they have been submitted.
- Check your email inbox for a confirmation email with a list of your entries and any related fees.
- You will receive a second email when your entries have been approved by your fair.
